Veterans Park Project Update

The Veterans Park Committee met in the park to discuss and layout options for placement of an additional shade structure and the appropriate size. It was determined that a 40x40 was much too large for the park, a 10x20 was more suitable but still on the larger side. The final decision being a 12x12 structure. There is one table situated under a large oak tree, if a structure was placed over the table a branch or two would have to be removed thus destroying the majestic beauty of the tree, it was decided to keep the tree as is for all to enjoy its beauty. There is a drainage issue in one area of the park, with proper placement of the additional shade structure a worked around is very viable.

The Veterans Park Committee has been in discussions with numerous monument companies and had narrowed it down to two finalists. The committee received the project bids from the both monument companies, these bids were for the acquisition and installation of the granite slabs to be installed in the park and will become the memorial wall with the District 5 Veteran's names. The Veterans Park Committee reviewed the bid proposals and voted to accept the bid from Stockton Monument. It was noted that both companies cautioned that there will be some delay in acquiring the granite due to on-going issues with the supply chain. Work on the granite will begin in as timely a manner as possible.

The committee has been in discussions with CalTrans regarding an extension path from the walking trail coming into Veterans Park thus tying the walking path and pathways within the park together. This extension is proposed along the southern edge of Arroyo Ditch. A tentative agreement has been reached.
